

SWOG Cancer Research Network is 1 of 5 major clinical research organizations funded by the NCI's National Clinical Trials Network (NCTN)

NCI National Clinical Trials Network Structure











NCTN Lead Academic Participating Sites (LAPS)



- Fred Hutch is one of 32 institutions awarded an NCTN LAPS grant
- LAPS sites are academic research institutions with fellowship training programs that enroll high numbers of patients and participate in scientific leadership, design, and conduct of NCTN clinical trials
- LAPS sites are not confined to participation in any specific NCTN cooperative group

NCI Community Oncology Research Program (NCORP)





NCORP:

- Community and minority/underserved sites enroll in NCTN trials
- Research bases design and conduct trials in cancer prevention, screening, supportive care and symptom management, QOL, and care delivery



SWOG Clinical Trials Partnerships (CTP)

- Limited liability company (LLC) formed under the Hope Foundation
- Independent corporation with its own leadership, processes, and funding agreements
- <u>Preferred Partnerships Program</u> designs and runs industry-supported trials with no federal funding
- Also supports federally funded SWOG trials by distributing industry funding for trial components

Research Awards

- SWOG/Hope IMPACT award
 - Mechanism for translating scientific discovery to patient care; encourages innovative approaches
- SWOG Early Exploration and Development (SEED) award
 - To encourage preliminary research that will translate to clinical trials or trial-associated projects
- Secondary data analysis
 - Covers costs connecting SWOG researchers with statistical support to conduct database analyses
- SWOG Trial Support (STrS)
 - Supports trial components that need supplemental funding







Young Investigator Award (YIA)

Application Deadline: September 22, 2022

Provides funding to promising young investigators to encourage and promote quality research in clinical oncology

1 year, \$50,000

Global Oncology Young Investigator Award (GO YIA)

Application Deadline: September 22, 2022

Provides research funding to early-career investigators to encourage and promote quality research in global oncology and to develop the next generation of researchers to address global health needs

Career Development Award (CDA)

Application Deadline: October 20, 2022

Provides research funding to clinical investigators, who have received their initial faculty appointment, as they work to establish an independent clinical cancer research program

• 3 years, \$200,000








Important Factors to Consider in the Oncology Job Search:

- Type of practice setting (e.g., academia, hybrid, community, industry, government)
- Geographic location
- Focus on a particular disease site (e.g., thoracic, breast, etc.)
- Balance of clinical time vs. research time
- Clinical and research infrastructure
- Availability of mentors within your desired field
- Access to clinical trials
- Salary and benefits
- Costs of living
- Job availability for your partner
